Business arising from previous minutes:</b>	<p>Responses to February resolutions:</p> <p><b>Arden Street safety</b></p> <p>Resolution 05022018(1): We are thankful that Council has had a look at this issue, but we don’t completely agree with the response. Can we request that Council investigate any number of the following: lines better marked, more signage, speed humps, chicanes, narrow the road in certain places or reduce the speed, to calm the traffic down and enable the facilities to be shared in a safer way. The precinct considers that the argument re the safety for the arterial route is a bit irrelevant. It has become a very busy road and needs to be looked at further.</p> <p><i>The Precinct’s request has been forwarded to Council’s Manager Integrated Transport, Mr Tony Lehmann for his consideration.</i></p> <p><b>Steps Clovelly Pool</b></p> <p>Resolution 05022018(2): the safety of the pool steps has been brought up again through injuries occurring using the slippery and narrow steps. We ask Council to revisit changing the steps either through moulded steps into the wall, non-slip cover for the slippery steps that are there, wider platforms, better non-slip grips for the railing, to make it safer to use. The stainless steel is just too slippery.</p>

	<p><i>The Precinct's request has been forwarded to Council's Manager Technical Services, Mr Joe Ingegneri for his consideration.</i></p> <p><b>Trees Beach Street</b></p> <p>Resolution 05022018(3): Could Council attend to the trees that have died along Beach Street and look at planting more, and to avoid them dying get someone to water them; a suggestion is to plant half the number of trees and use resources to water those that are planted.</p> <p><i>Council inspected the trees along Beach Street and there were only two small dead trees (outside 12 and 16) along Beach St, Clovelly. Council's Tree Gang will remove those trees.</i></p> <p><i>Council will plant a number of trees along both sides of Beach Street after 1 March 2018, which will be watered and maintained for a period of six months by the planting contractors.</i></p> <p><i>Contractors also letterbox drop adjacent property owners when they plant new street trees requesting them to water and nurture those trees until they become established.</i></p> <p><i>Regrettably, no amount of watering will save newly planted trees when they are hit with sporadic days of extremely hot and windy weather over a short period which seems to becoming much more prevalent these days.</i></p>
<p><b>10. General Business:</b></p>	<p><b>Burnie Street DA/Flood study</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 05032018(1):</b> The Precinct would like to know the outcome of the flood study. Is there a connection and is it relevant to the current site for the Burnie St childcare development. Kirsty/Stuart. CARRIED</p> <p><b>Resolution 05032018(2):</b> The Burnie Street development is a very important development for the area. Many residents are concerned about overdevelopment and flooding in this spot. The Precinct requests a planner or someone from council to come and speak at the next precinct meeting to discuss council's views and answer our questions and concerns. Edwin/Stuart CARRIED</p>

Other Business:</b></p>	<p><b>Burnie St pavement</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 05032018(3):</b> Thank you for fixing the pavement along the commercial area on two sides of Burnie St (38 to 50 and 29 to 43 Burnie Street commercial shops at the end of Burnie St that intersects with Clovelly road and also opposite the Clovelly hotel where the café is.) Is there any way it could be beautified as it is looking a bit patchworked and unfinished and not as good as it looked before. It is not in line with the</p>

	<p>unique heritage character of the area. Some residents and shop owners are considering putting beautiful pot plants out the front of shops but don't want to do it until the pavement is fixed. CARRIED</p> <p><b>Bikes – update</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 05032018(4):</b> The Precinct is concerned that nothing is happening about the dumped bikes in the area. Can Council please provide an update as to what is happening with the public bikes? They are an eyesore and they are everywhere - being left on private property, in driveways, etc. and they are not in good condition. We are receiving lots of complaints.
