<b>Date, meeting time and venue</b>	7.30pm 7 November 2018 in the Malabar Room, Randwick City Council, Avoca Street, Randwick
<b>Welcome:</b>	<p>Larry Vincent, Chair.</p> <p>Larry welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave an Acknowledgement of the local Indigenous People:</p> <p>"I would like to acknowledge that we are meeting on the land of the Bidjigal and the Gadigal peoples who occupied the Sydney Coast, being the traditional owners. On behalf of the Randwick Precinct Committee, I acknowledge and pay my respects to the Elders both past and present, to Aboriginal people in attendance today, and the many rich cultures of the people who live in Randwick."</p>

<b>4. Confirmation of previous minutes:</b>	Minutes of October 2018 meeting were accepted.
<b>5. Presentation – Randwick campus redevelopment project team</b>	<p>Helen introduced David Brennan and Lauren Hosken, from the project team, who gave an update about progress and what is happening in the future, with the Randwick campus redevelopment.</p> <p>\$720m is being invested to deliver a new Acute Services Building for POW hospital. The first stage is a catalyst project to deliver a world-class health, research and education precinct, with cutting-edge, compassionate and holistic healthcare and wellness programs to the local community and NSW residents. The new Acute Services Building includes: New adult ED, a Psychiatric Emergency Care Centre, and expanded ICU, a new rapid assessment unit including a Virtual Care Centre, contemporary inpatient units that will replace aging infrastructure, new operating theatres for the Randwick Hospitals' campus, a new helipad shared with POW, Royal Hospital for Women and Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick.</p> <p>Interim expansion kicked off last year to the ED and has been put into practice, with 8 new treatment places, 10 refurbished, a range of improvements to ED. Construction complete. Stage 1 opened in June.</p> <p>This month – running a focus group on 20 November.</p> <p>Larry thanked David and Lauren for their presentation. David invited further feedback.</p>
<b>6. Annual General Meeting and Election of Office Bearers</b>	<p>Larry confirmed that under council guidelines the chair rotates every two years and he would therefore be standing down, as would Treasurer Bill Roberts.</p> <p>Nominations were called for the positions of Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. No nominations were received.</p> <p>Larry advised that in the absence of nominations, the next meeting would be held in February. Larry will advise Amanda that no nominations were received, and get advice from her.</p> <p>Larry thanked Jo Chittick and Amanda Maher for their work. Bill thanked Larry for his role as chair for the last two years.</p>

Business arising from previous minutes:</b></p>	<p><b>Responses to October Resolutions:</b></p> <p>Resolution 03102018(1): That the Precinct Committee supports Randwick City Council in making safe the pedestrian and cycling connections to all the light rail stops and especially the High Street Terminus at the Randwick Town Centre which will be a major interchange for residents living in the immediate area.</p> <p><i>The Precinct's resolution has been noted and forwarded to Council's Integrated Transport team for their information.</i></p> <p><b>Resolution 07112018(1):</b> Due to the urgency of providing safe cycling to the light rail terminus, Council's response to resolution 03102018(1) is inadequate. Council are asked to accept that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) We need safe cycling routes from all directions to the light rail terminus</li> <li>b) We need as many built prior to its opening as possible</li> <li>c) Council land the State RMS need to budget sufficient funds for these</li> <li>d) Design work must start this financial year (to have any hope of completion in time).</li> </ul> <p>Jonathan/Larry CARRIED</p> <p>Resolution 03102018(2): That the Precinct Committee asks that Randwick City Council build more kerbside gardens in the Randwick Town Centre Precinct including in Avoca Street, adjacent to the intersection at Allison Road.</p> <p><i>The Precinct's request has been sent to Mr Joe Ingegneri, Acting Director City Services for his consideration.</i></p> <p>Resolution 03102018(3): The Precinct requests that Randwick Traffic Committee for item 4.6 The Spot Resident Parking Scheme area SP1 in the October 2018 Committee correct the statement that there "has not been major changes to the land use pattern in this area" noting that the St Basils Village on St Pauls Street has been built on a site previously vacant.</p> <p><i>From the draft minutes of the Randwick Traffic Committee meeting, 9 October 2018: The Randwick Precinct has advised the Traffic Committee that it believes that the passage stating that there "has not been major changes to the land use pattern in this area" is incorrect, noting that the St Basil's on St Pauls Street, Randwick has been built on a site previously vacant. Mr Price advised the members of the Traffic Committee that, as St Basil's is a retirement village the impact of the development on the area's on-street parking is negligible and not considered a major change for the purpose of the RA1 study.</i></p>

General Business</b></p>	<p><b>Notices</b></p> <p>Precinct Coordination Committee meeting is on Wednesday 5 December 6.30pm – meet the new General Manager, Therese Manns</p> <p><b>Pedestrian crossing on Perouse Road beside Soudan Street</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 07112018(2):</b> The Precinct requests that Randwick Council investigate installing a traffic hump on the existing pedestrian crossing on Perouse Road by the Soudan Street/Aeolia Street intersection. William/Larry CARRIED</p> <p><b>Closure of Judge St stairs</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 07112018(3):</b> Randwick Precinct still awaits a response to September 2018 resolutions 05092018(4) and 05092018(5) in relation to Judge Street stairs and adjacent reserve. This issue has been unresolved since 2012/13 and residents are disappointed in the lack of progress and poor communication on this matter. Stef/Larry CARRIED</p> <p><b>T-intersection Milford and Avoca Streets</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 07112018(4):</b> Could the traffic committee investigate the T-intersection at Milford and Avoca Streets, Randwick with a view to mark the road with “keep clear signage” similar to signage at Avoca and Albert Streets, Randwick. Stefan/Larry CARRIED</p> <p><b>Montefiore access</b></p> <p><b>Resolution 07112018(5):</b> That Council please consider and designate and sign the short section of footpath between Montefiore’s Dangar Street entry and Govett Lane for shared path use, as soon as possible. This avoids using Dangar Street for this 35m section, where the road shoulder lane is too narrow and also avoids the need to cross this busy street when returning to the Home. Access to and from Montefiore is severely restricted due to a 20-month on-site construction program. This means Trishaw access to and from the King Street gate will often not be available. In this situation, the safest route from the Home to Centennial Park is via Govett and Mort Lanes and Evans Street, for crossing of Darley Road and entry-exit through the CP’s Govett Gate.
