Business arising from previous minutes:	<p>Precinct coordinator's response to February resolutions:</p> <p>Support for safe cycling environment Resolution 07022018(1): The Precinct supports current initiatives and funding by Council to make RCC a 'safe cycling' environment for pedestrians, cyclists and motor vehicles. <i>The Precinct's support has been noted.</i></p> <p>Return and earn machines Resolution 07022018(2): The Precinct requests Council to ask the NSW Government to increase the number of return and earn machines in the area (only one is at UNSW and it is inaccessible to vehicles), [Coogee Oval, central parking reservation at Maroubra Junction and Clovelly Beach carpark, Heffron Park and other locations are suggested]. Could Council correspond with Randwick Plaza and Royal Randwick Shopping Centre to ask them to consider installing machines (inside supermarkets). <i>The Precinct's request has been sent to Council's Sustainability team for consideration. A response will be sent as soon as possible.</i></p>

Presentation:	<p>David Brenner, Nicky Seaby – Randwick Campus re-development</p> <p>David gave a presentation on the Randwick Campus re-development project, covering:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What's inside the new acute services building. • What to expect this year • Current works – interim emergency dept expansion • Q & A

	<p>He said the re-development is to ensure POW and Randwick campus can meet the needs of the growing population and will integrate health, research, education and training services which is crucial to delivering contemporary service and best quality health care</p> <p>Stage 1 – acute services building will include a much larger and improved emergency department; a new intensive care unit; five levels of inpatient units; new shared operating theatres for the campus; improved access arrangements; a new helipad and more contemporary technology.</p> <p>They are engaging the community through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community and Consumer Advisory Group established and engaged; • Letterbox drops to 7500 homes and businesses surrounding the hospital campus • Email updates to subscribers • Regular door knocks with Magill Street residents • Meetings and updates with local groups and schools • Pop up stand inside the POW hospital • Mid-year EIS on exhibition, will run community drop-ins. <p>Interim Emergency Department expansion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work is currently underway on expansion of current adult ED • ED will remain open and operational at all times • Work is expected to be complete by the end of the year. • Works will meet projected growth in demand until the new ASB opens in 2022. <p>Bob and Joy Wilson, Chair Consumer and Community Advisory Committee welcome others to be involved.
