Resolution 05092018(1): The Precinct would like to request that Council address the greening of Randwick Shopping Centre (Belmore Road) with trees, shrubs, hanging plants, etc. Overhead awnings have been raised as an obstacle which is not considered to be satisfactory.

*Council is currently undertaking a strategic review of Randwick Junction Town Centre, to identify the strategic role of Randwick Junction in response to the population and employment growth and changing environment and infrastructure, such as the introduction of light rail and proposed hospital expansion.*

*A key component of the town centre review is to identify opportunities for public domain improvement and enhanced streetscape cohesion. The request from the Precinct to green Royal Randwick Shopping Centre will be considered and if suitable, will be incorporated into the town centre strategy.*

*The draft strategy, once reported to Council, will be placed for public consultation, anticipated to commence early-mid next year. Consultation activities will likely involve presentations to relevant local Precincts, community focus groups and drop-in sessions, etc.*

### **Safe cycling:**

Resolution 05092018(2): The Precinct requests that to make cycling safer in Randwick, all identified cycling routes from the maps have cycling logos painted on them to make drivers aware that they are cycling routes, no matter how busy the street.

*Council's Cycleways and Bicycles Facilities Advisory Committee is examining this matter.*

### **Racecourse training ground**

Resolution 05092018(3): Could Council advise what is known re the addition of the AFL training ground in Randwick Racecourse and what is proposed for parking provision on race day events?

### **Albi Place/Judge Street - repair of stairs and reserve replanting**
