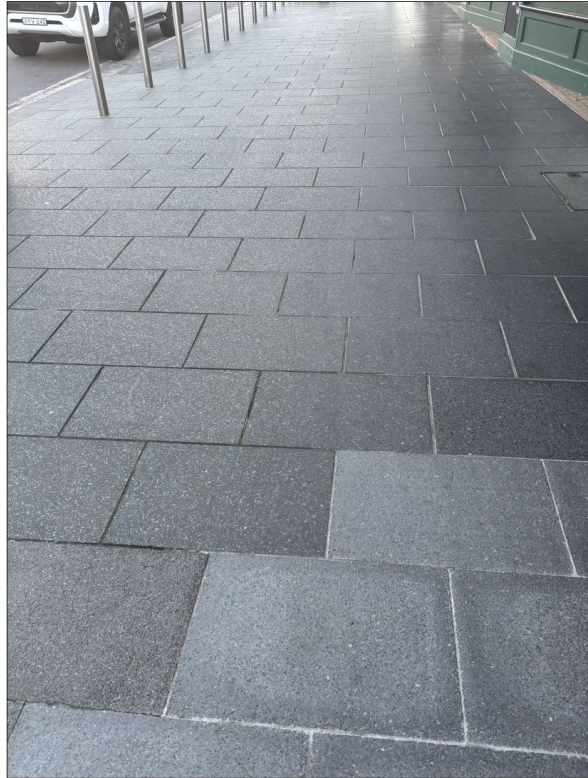

Resolution 12052025(5): Update on the pedestrian crossing at Matraville High School at Franklin St. Can council advise the timeline for the construction of the pedestrian crossing opposite the school on Franklin St.

Council response

Unfortunately, Transport for NSW (TfNSW) has advised that they can no longer support the introduction of a raised pedestrian crossing at the location of the existing Franklin Street pedestrian refuge, 90m west of Anzac Parade, as they do not permit pedestrian crossings on roads with a 60km/h speed limit.

As per my reply to the Precinct's Resolution no.10032025(2) of 10 March 2025: "Councils within NSW have no legal authority to modify speed limits. That legal authority rests with Transport for NSW (TfNSW). " As the Precinct is aware, Council has been seeking a reduction in the speed limit along Franklin Street, for some years. On each occasion, when Council has sought a reduction of the existing 60km/h speed limit down to a 50km/h speed limit, TfNSW has rejected our request.

Our most recent request was earlier this year when we sought to have the speed limit reduced, so that a raised zebra crossing could be installed at the pedestrian refuge located near to Burke Street. TfNSW again indicated that they did not support the suggested speed reduction. Without the support of TfNSW, the Council can take no action regarding the speed limit.

The Council shares the community's disappointment that TfNSW (a state government agency) continues to not support the requested speed limit and that, as a result, the proposed raised pedestrian crossing cannot be installed.

Council response

I can advise that a dog attack incident at Purcell Park, Matraville was reported to Council on May 20, 2025. Since this incident Randwick Council Rangers have been undertaking regular patrols of Purcell Park with regard to unleash/loose dogs.

Specific information we have received from residents indicates that the most common times for unleashed dogs to be observed in the area is after 4pm. Subsequently, our patrols will focus on early mornings and afternoons.

If residents observe off leash dogs in a restricted area or witness a dog attack incident, I would encourage them to contact Randwick City Council on 1300 722 542 so that Council Rangers may investigate and respond accordingly.

Matraville town centre streetscape upgrade

Stage 2

16 June 2025

CONSTRUCTION NOTIFICATION



Randwick City Council is continuing streetscape upgrade works in the Matraville town centre to improve the amenity and appearance of the area.

The upcoming works will take place along the western side of Bunnerong Road, between Perry Street and Daunt Avenue. Improvements will include an upgraded footpath, street trees and plantings, and seating.

This stage follows upgrades completed in mid-2024 along the western side of Bunnerong Road from Beauchamp Road to Daunt Avenue.

Project background

Randwick City Council developed a public domain masterplan in 2022 and 2023 to guide the long-term vision for the Matraville Town Centre.

The plan was developed through consultation with local residents and businesses and aims to create a distinctive town centre with gathering spaces and welcoming gateways, more outdoor dining and opportunities for community events.

The streetscape upgrade works being undertaken by Council are consistent with the short-term actions from the masterplan and will pave the way for future improvements.

What's happening

Construction start: Late July 2025

Expected completion: Late December 2025 (weather permitting)

The streetscape upgrade will enhance the look and feel of the public space and support local businesses through high-quality design and improved public

infrastructure. These works form part of Council's broader strategic vision for the town centre.

Scope of works includes:

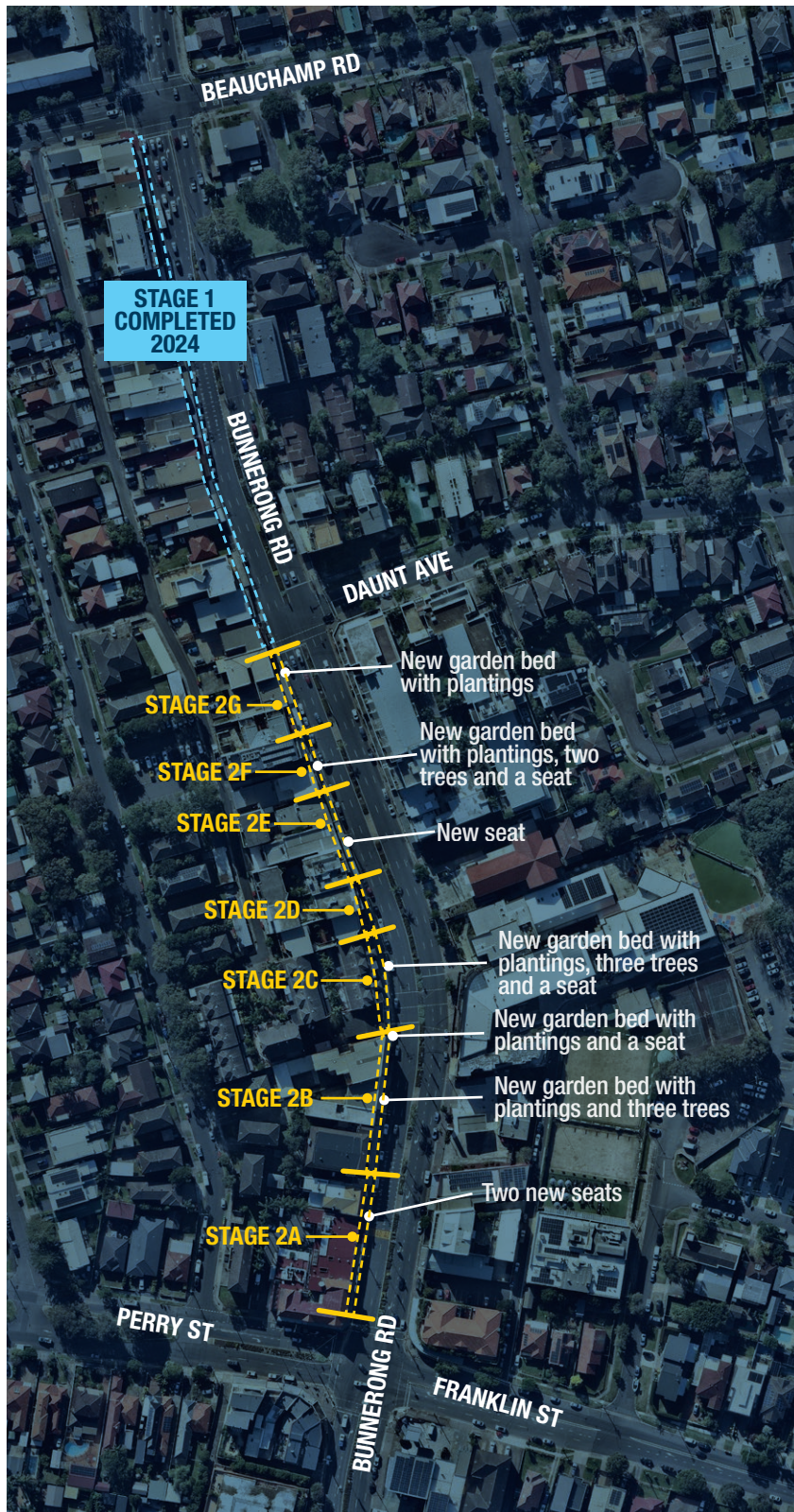
- Removal of the existing footpath and installation of a new asphalt footpath to match the 2024 upgrade
- Landscaping upgrades - new native plantings and advanced trees
- New public seating
- Minor civil works and repairs

Construction will be staged to minimise disruption.

What to expect during construction

- Working hours: Works will occur both during the day (7am–5pm) and at night (7pm–5am). Night works will focus on lower-impact activities to reduce disturbance to residents.
- Traffic and parking: Traffic control and signage will help manage vehicle flow around the work zone. Temporary removal of sections of the northbound parking lane on Bunnerong Road will be required.
- Pedestrian access: Footpath access will be limited in work zones. Traffic controllers will be onsite to guide pedestrians safely around the area.
- Business access: We'll work closely with local businesses to minimise disruption during trading hours. Traffic controllers will be onsite to assist temporary pedestrian detours, and access to shops will be maintained where possible.
- Bus stop changes: The bus stop in the area will be temporarily relocated during the works. Signage and traffic controllers will be in place to assist passengers.

We understand construction may cause temporary inconvenience and appreciate your patience. Council is committed to delivering these improvements efficiently, with a focus on safety and minimising disruption to residents, businesses and visitors.
