

New pop-up cycleway in your neighbourhood

Transforming Sydney's streets to protect your health

Transport for NSW is working with Randwick Council to deliver a new pop-up cycleway (see map over the page) as part of the NSW Government's response to COVID-19 to give you safe travel options. This is a key public health measure being delivered on the advice of our health experts.

Todman Avenue

A pop-up cycleway will soon be installed in your neighbourhood. The cycleway forms part of a network which connects Waterloo to the University of NSW, the Prince of Wales Hospital precinct and Royal Randwick Racecourse.

Pop-up cycleway Todman Avenue

- This route was chosen as there is an existing on-street cycleway located on Todman Avenue, Kensington. This project will upgrade these facilities to improve cyclist's safety
- The pop-up cycleway will connect to the existing cycleway on O'Dea Avenue, Waterloo and the existing on-road cycle facilities on Doncaster Avenue, Kensington
- The pop-up cycleway also offers the community a safe route for exercise



Pop-up location

The pop-up cycleway will start at the Eastern Distributor and run along Todman Avenue for 1350 meters to Doncaster Avenue, Kensington.

It will be placed between the kerb and parking spaces and have one lane going in each direction on the northern side of the road. A physical barrier to parked cars will also be installed for cyclist safety.

Some parking spaces on Todman Avenue may be reduced to accommodate the pop-up cycleway. Transport for NSW is currently working with Randwick Council to prepare a detailed design to determine the changes to parking

We will seek to reduce any changes to the number of parking spaces as we recognise its importance to the community.

Installation

The work to install the pop-up cycleway is anticipated to start in about two months.


To reduce disruption to motorists and public transport users, the work will take place mostly during the night, however some work may take place during the day.

To reduce noise, hand tools will be used where possible and on-site machinery and equipment will be limited after 11pm.

More information about the installation of the pop-up cycleway will be sent shortly.

There will be temporary traffic changes while the pop-up cycleway is installed to ensure the work zone is safe. Any temporary parking changes will be removed as soon as the cycleway is installed.
