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## Resolution:

Resolution 060622(2): That advice be sought from the Council about what options were available to residents in relation to restrictions on parking of boats, trailers and other large vehicles, and what detail is required by Council when considering any submissions.

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## Council response:

The current legislation regarding many of the issues raised by the Precinct have often been found to be 'not fit for purpose'. In other words, the processes called up by the legislation are not effective and there are loop holes which stymie an outcome satisfactory to the community.

However, the Council looks forward to proclamation of the Public Spaces (Unattended Property) Act 2021 legislation. The guidance provided by the Office of Local Government suggests that this legislation will significantly streamline processes and improve outcomes.

We trust that the State Government proclaims the legislation soon.

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## Resolution:

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## Council response:

It is very unfortunate that Council Officers are unable to control the behaviour of individual in our community including the applicant. This is the first time that such matter has been brought to my attention and I am prepared to investigate the matter and have further conversation with the relevant parties to ensure all residents being treated equally in our community.
