Thank you very much for your enquiry regarding this iconic heritage site now under the care and management of Council; we are pleased that there is such strong interest in the future use of the Big Stable.

Council is now undergoing a comprehensive analysis of the building, firstly via a conservation and architectural analysis of the condition of the Stable to determine ongoing care and maintenance of this listed site. We will then commission a potential future use review to ensure its unique heritage character, location and space is utilised for community benefit.

Council response:

Thank you for your correspondence in relation to the request for a pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Rainbow Street and Botany Street (at Paine Reserve). The future North-South Paine Reserve path is forthcoming and Transport for NSW are considering providing an additional connection via Byrd Avenue.

Council will continue to work with Transport for NSW to investigate the pedestrian crossing options. Notwithstanding, as this section of Rainbow Street is a state road, please contact TfNSW.
