Resolution 07082024(3): Planning department to notify a wider geographical area where the proposed DA involves an expansion of a large development such as school or hospital.

Council response

Council's Community Engagement Strategy states when notifying adjoining land owners and occupants of a development proposal, the Council will send letters to owners and occupiers within a 40m radius measured from each boundary of the development site. The notification area may be increased or decreased at the discretion of a Council planning officer, considering the nature and the likely impact of the proposal. Resolution 07082024(2): Council to ensure that the spray paint markings [road markings done by its own contractors and other contractors (eg Sydney Water, Ausgrid and Telstra)] are removed once the work is completed.

Council response:

Council and other service providers use a spray and mark paint to identify areas in the public domain for repair. This marking paint is designed to last up to 12 months in outdoor environments.

Inspections and associated markings are undertaken in advance. Subsequent reparation works are generally conducted within the following day to twelve months, dependant on various factors including the urgency of the job, availability of resources and other priorities. As Council uses marking paint to define the extent of a job, the paint is usually removed once the job is completed, as the previously marked asset is now replaced.

Some jobs require service locating whereby markings are used to indicate underground services. In these situations, it is sometimes the case that the surfaces that have been marked are not subject to renewal and therefore the markings remain in place until the paint wears off.

Whilst Council aims to remove marking paint at the completion of job, there will be instances where markings, whether they are created by Council or another entity, are left once the job is completed. In these instances, it recommended that customers contact Council to request the removal of marking paint.
