

Community Investment Program – FEBRUARY 2023 ROUND Funded projects

COMMUNITY CREATIVE: To support the growth of creativity within Randwick City by funding a range of projects, programs and activities that provide opportunities for individual creative practitioners, groups or organisations to connect communities and showcase creative arts and culture within the City.
Annual budget for 2022/23: \$170,000.

For the February 2023 round, Council received 17 applications, requesting a total of **\$124,979**. This figure includes requests for cash contributions **and** support in-kind (ie., waiving of fees for the use of Council facilities). The available budget for the round was ~\$56,000.

9 applications were approved, with a total of **\$55,929.00** granted. A description of approved projects and breakdown of funding amounts is listed below.
