9. Guest Speaker	<p>Q&A with Guest Speaker – Anil Gupta Anil gave a very comprehensive overview of good waste practices and also what is done with our waste. Key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - FOGO changes have ben instigated by the EPA, they want to make the compost that is produced as clean as possible. No pet poo or paper (eg tissues, paper towels, cardboard) can be put in FOGO - FOGO bags will no longer be delivered quarterly nor can they picked up. There will be one delivery per year (around October), outside of this time to order a new pack of caddy liners you have two options: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Order a pack online here, or 2. Call Customer Service Centre on 9093 6000 or 1300 722 542 <p>-Empty pizza boxes can go in yellow bin; when throwing UberEATS/Takeaway bags out make sure you unbag and sort before chucking in the bin;</p> <p>- Soft plastics, hard plastics, x-rays, light bulbs, batteries, paint can all go to the recycling centre</p> <p>- You can also book six free clean-up collections every year, there is one scheduled collection (refer to your waste calendar for dates) and five booked collections</p> <p>- If you can't get to the Recycling Centre then Randwick City Council has partnered with RecycleSmart to help our community recycle from home using the RecycleSmart Power Pickup service. They collect your hard-to-recycle items from your doorstep and deliver them to our Randwick Recycle Centre at 72 Perry Street Matraville.</p> <p>You can subscribe to a Free and recurring Power Pickup plan (up to 2 bags collected) or book a Power Pickup as often as needed for just \$5 per bag (minimum 2 bags) through the RecycleSmart app or website. (Leave the bags at your door or under your letterbox).</p>
