Resolution 04122024(2): The Precinct requests that Council review standards of playgrounds to ensure they are safe and high amenity, including high quality shade cover, soft fall, fencing, seating, BBQ areas and toilets, etc.

Council response

Council adopted a Play Space Strategy in 2023 that assessed our play spaces against the 'Anyone Can Play' guideline from the NSW Government. The Strategy also sought to address the recommendations from the Open Space and Recreation Needs Study 2020.

The Strategy categorises each of the 59 play spaces into the following:

- Pocket Park
- Local Park
- Neighbourhood Park
- District Park
- Regional Park

Each category has varying infrastructure to support the play equipment and capacity. This includes picnic tables, bubblers, toilets and BBQs. However, this infrastructure is only for the higher categories and BBQs are only for District and Regional parks.

The strategy will help inform the design of playgrounds and play spaces when they come up for renewal. Our current design standards already include fencing, softfall, seating and shade sails.

Each design concept undergoes community consultation to allow the local community to provide input into the design.

Based on this approach, we will be able to provide high quality play spaces that can be sustainably funded.

Resolution 04122024(3): The Precinct requests that Council investigate the removal of parking on Botany Street around these T-junctions during peak AM and PM to allow vehicles travelling along Botany St (behind the turning vehicles) to pass.

Council Response

Given that Botany Street is not considered as a main road and given that removal of parking for through traffic purposes would result in a loss of local parking supply for local residents and given that clearing out the parking would likely result in higher speeds along this residential street, my guidance to the Precinct and the Council is that the existing parking be retained. The resultant delays along Botany Street may deter through traffic motorists from other suburbs from using Botany Street as a 'rat-run'.
