Business arising from previous minutes	<p>A big thank you to residents for advising issues prior to the meeting, but could any residents raising issues for discussion please ensure that they are present at the meeting to outline their concerns otherwise their issue will be held over to the next meeting.</p> <p>Noisy speed humps in Elaroo Ave. Councillors Noel D'Souza and Bill Burst confirmed that Council is aware of the noise issue and will remove the temporary speed humps and replace them with measures similar to those adopted for Yarra Road. Noel and Bill to confirm when this work will be completed.</p> <p>Anzac Pde illegal parking on green strip between Jennifer St and Bunnerong Rd. The number of vehicles (boats, caravans etc) appears to be increasing. A request to discuss this issue was received from a resident, who didn't attend and this item was held over to the next meeting. Councillor Danny Said also has some suggestions on how this issue could be managed and will present these at the next meeting.</p> <p>Restoration of Congwong beach toilet. This issue was first raised two years ago, and a design proposal was made, however nothing has been progressed. Councillors Noel D'Souza and Bill Burst will follow up and report back to the Precinct committee.</p>

<p>New Issues</p>	<p>Off leash dogs being exercised near Little Bay Chapel Adrienne Pearson raised the issue of off-leash dogs being exercised near the Chapel and damaging the grassed area. Because of the distance to the Woomera Reserve off leash area, it was suggested that a new off-leash dog area be set aside in Little Bay. That might resolve the use of this area - even if it the new area is only available for set time slots. Adrienne to follow up with Council Rangers, Chris to liaise with Council and the PHCA committee.</p> <p>ADDENDA: Resident’s communications with Council The issue of Council not responding promptly to queries from residents was raised, but the resident was not present and this item will be held over to the next meeting.</p>

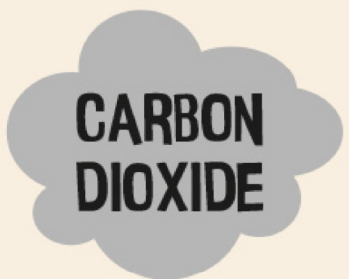
