6. Business arising from previous minutes:	Noted the lack of progress on the outstanding items.
7. Correspondence:	1. Resolution 07052025(2): Randwick Council to urgently install lights along the footpath through Bob's Garden. Response: Council officers have reviewed the resolution and note that there are 2 lights on long brackets off power poles at each end of the pathway between Dudley Street and Carrington Road. This lighting will be inspected at night to determine if the lights are working and whether the vegetation obscures the lighting. After the lighting design is finalised, the project will be listed for consideration in a future capital works program. 2. Resolution 07052025(3): Randwick Council to investigate the installation of a Give Way sign on Carr St where it intersects with Carrington Rd as a possible solution to traffic congestion on this major intersection. Response: The topography in this whole area is challenging and the subject location, combined with the Dudley Street / Howard Street intersection is complex. However, a review of the last five years of reported crash statistics for this combined intersection indicates that the site is performing well from a road safety perspective NEW CORRESPONDANCE 3. The Spot & Randwick Chamber of Commerce thanked us for our support of local businesses over the Spot Upgrade.

	4. Resolution 02072025(1) - The Spot Streetscape Upgrades, Footpath Extension. Council acknowledges and appreciates your feedback on the proposed streetscape upgrades in The Spot, Randwick. In line with Council's urgent business resolution (UB5/25), Council Officers are currently in the process of planning for further consultation, coupled with further assessment of the proposed upgrades to address concerns which the community and businesses may have. At this stage, there are no plans to commence with construction activities until further consultation has been carried out. Once more details are available, the community, businesses and the precincts will be invited to provide feedback on the proposal again. 5. Roadworks on Belmore Road and Avoca Street, Randwick extended to September due to unforeseen site conditions and bad weather.
