Resolution:

Resolution 8/22: Randwick Council to be asked what actions (in conjunction) with NSW police are being undertaken to address the illegal parking of motorcycles near the Coogee Pavilion.

Council response:

Background:

At the Coogee precinct Committee held on 16 May 2022 a resolution was put forward (Resolution 8/22 F2004/08046) asking Council what actions (in conjunction) with NSW police are being undertaken to address the illegal parking of motorcycles near the Coogee Pavilion.

Illegal parking enforcement within Randwick is primarily undertaken by Randwick City Council Rangers and Parking Patrol Officers through both proactive patrolling as well as responding to complaints received by customers. NSW Police will often liaise with Council to report illegally parked vehicles that are either causing a hazard or obstructing traffic.

Currently Randwick City Council Rangers and Parking Patrol officers conduct daily illegal parking patrols of Coogee Beach including the areas adjacent to the Coogee Pavilion, located on the corner of Dolphin and Beach St.

On receipt of the resolution (8/22) Councils Coordinator Ranger Services arranged for Council Rangers to monitor the area in peak times (weekends) over a period of 6 weeks in order to identify any issues and patterns of illegal parking activity occurring.

Issues:

1. Throughout the period of investigation Randwick City Council Rangers identified minor levels of illegal parking activity being undertaken by motorcycles within the vicinity of the Coogee Pavilion.
2. In total 4 penalty infringement notices were issued to motorcycles for the offence of 'Stop on path/strip'.

3. The main area impacted by this activity appears to be the forecourt of the Coogee Pavilion adjacent to the bike racks at the Eastern most end of the Dolphin St Car Park. On all occasions where motorcycles were witnessed illegally parked in this location the allocated motorcycle parking bays located within the Dolphin St carpark were occupied.

Conclusion:

1. The current level of illegal parking activity witnessed appears to be minor and should be able to be effectively managed through current daily patrolling of the area as well as Officers responding to any complaints received by Council.
2. The illegal parking activity appears to be occurring when the allocated motorcycle bays within the Dolphin Street carpark are fully occupied.
3. Randwick Council Rangers will undertake regular patrols of the area through Spring and Summer to identify whether there is a significant change in the level of illegal motorcycle parking activity and undertake appropriate regulatory action.

Resolution:

Resolution 9/22: Council to advise of the regulations regarding the permitted time of open windows at venues with live music and the associated noise levels.

Council response:

Reference is made to the above-mentioned precinct resolution, there are no specific times for licensed premises which regulate the permitted time of open windows at venues with live music and associated noise levels unless this has been specified as a condition of consent.

Most licensed premises have liquor licence noise conditions which encompass noise emission from entertainment, patrons and other operational noise sources. This is commonly referred to as the Liquor and Gaming NSW standard noise criteria for licenced premises.

It should also be noted that in recent times there has been a significant shift in public policy position at a State Government level to encourage and promote live entertainment, particularly in licensed venues as an integral part of the revitalisation of the NSW night-time economy.

Resolution:

Resolution 10/22: Randwick Council to be asked for the screening to only be erected on game days and the said screening to be of environmentally sustainable material.

Council response:

During the winter season a fence is installed along the eastern boundary of Coogee Oval and a screen is erected. These measures are undertaken for crowd control on match days and to prevent the public congregating and watching on from outside the ground, rather than paying for tickets and entering the ground.

The screening is cumbersome and time consuming to install and, therefore, is done at the start of the season and remains up until the end of the season. Despite the fence and screening, Coogee Oval is still accessible to the public when there are no matches being played.

I note your sensible suggestion regarding the sustainability of the materials used in the screening. I will investigate the sustainability of the materials on the market through the supplier that provides the screen to achieve the most sustainable outcome.
