	Motion 2 – standards of playgrounds

	Alison Park Playground – No shade, equipment is hot to touch and, in

The slide at the playground adjacent to the Preschool and Community Education Centre at the Randwick Environment Park is also problematic. Can be too hot to touch.

Parks in surrounding suburbs such as Zetland have bbq areas, wide gates, clean seats to sit on and plenty of shade. Some even have sandpits and waterwheels.

Resolution: The Precinct requests that Council review standards of playgrounds to ensure they are safe and high amenity, including high quality shade cover, soft fall, fencing, seating, BBQ areas and toilets, etc.

Motion 3: Congestion on Botany Street

Background

The traffic situation every weekday and evening on Botany and Barker Street is congested around the intersections of Blenheim, Hay and Magill Streets. One of the main reasons for this is the vehicles parked along the T-junction stretch during the peak hours in the morning and evening.

Any vehicle attempting to turn into one of these streets from Botany must wait for the traffic to clear from the opposite lane. This blocks the other vehicles in the same line behind.

Hay Street and Maud street is a popular rat run for avoiding the lights at Barker and Botany.

Resolution: The Precinct requests that Council investigate the removal of parking on Botany Street around these T-junctions during peak AM and PM to allow vehicles travelling along Botany St (behind the turning vehicles) to pass.

- Support for Cycleway from resident: I ride a bike regularly. I live on Sturt St. Sturt St Cycleway has been designed and we've been promised it for years. The design is good! It must be funded.



 Wallace Street west from Botany St intersection is already a major traffic problem caused by very consistent traffic (incl. trucks) both ways and to/from all 4 ways at the intersection. Feedback about Sturt Street Cycleway: Sturt Street has too many blind intersections for a cycleway and the traffic bank up currently is just too dangerous. Entering Sturt from Rigney is prone to blind spots from backed up cars and trees on the verge. I think it is a problem with traffic and not bicycle specific, I would be very supportive of any efforts to improve visibility on Sturt Link for South Coogee to Kingsford proposed Cycleway - link I am very concerned about the intersection: Sturt St with Anzac Parade - this is a huge bottleneck in peak periods - all the way back to Botany Street then there is the broad expanse of Anzac Parade to cross. I cannot get out of my driveway during peak times and the number of cars who run the lights is alarming
