Resolution:

Resolution 03042024(1): Request Randwick Council to respond to Resolution 06072022(2) that asks for an official response to the multiple emails and requests on the Govett St Gates that has been in discussion for 11 years.

Council response:

In order to better understand the consequences of closing the Parkes Drive gate at the Darley Road / Govett Street intersection, Greater Sydney Parklands (GSP) has asked for a traffic analysis to be undertaken. GSP want to ensure that there are no unintended consequences arising from closing the subject gates. The Council has currently sought quotes from appropriate consultants to analyse the data.

Following an examination of the analysis, GSP will determine its position regarding the closure of the gates. GSP may require its own community consultation regarding the gates closure proposal.

We await their assessment of the gate closing option, before furthering our design/s.

Council response:

In following up this matter, Council officers have recently liaised with TfNSW officers. TfNSW wanted details about the concerns of community members.

TfNSW was advised that that community members are concerned about:

- heavy traffic volumes along Frenchmans Road providing limited coinciding crossing gaps,
- speeding vehicles
- pedestrians wanting to cross the road
- crossing Frenchmans Road at the northern end of the local shopping precinct; near to Kemmis Street / Roscrea Avenue

We await further response from TfNSW.

Resolution 03042024(4): Council to continue with the current security measures [i.e. security guards at Waratah Ave Plaza] and consider continuing in the future.

Council response:

Thank you for the comments regarding the security in place for the completion of the Waratah Plaza project, and also for the Opening of the Plaza. Unfortunately Council cannot provide ongoing security monitoring at civic spaces outside of events or during certain times of construction or maintenance.

However we are pleased to advise that the Plaza has recently had CCTV now installed to address any security issues and to have a higher degree of regular surveillance in that area. We have also liaised with the local police area to ensure that the Waratah Plaza remains a highly used and safe community use area.

Our Economic Development team are also planning a series of small events and performances in the upcoming months as part of a council-wide program to activate our civic plazas.

Resolution 05062024(1): Taxi rank Short Street and Arthur Street.

Carmen Avilla will speak at the Traffic Committee Meeting on 11 June discussing alternative location considerations and resident concerns about traffic flow and direction.

Precinct would like to postpone the decision until more discussion can be had before proceeding.

Council response:

An item was submitted to previous Local Traffic Committee (LTC) meetings regarding options for a Taxi Rank on Short Street or Arthur Street. This correspondence is with regards to the preferred arrangement of the Taxi Rank which was submitted to the August LTC meeting held on 13 August 2024.

The recommendation from this meeting was:

- a) That the resident who requested the Taxi Rank, any parties that submitted comment regarding this item, and the NSW Taxi Council be informed of the recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee.
- b) That the proposed Taxi Zone and relocated Motorcycle Parking zone are installed, for a trial period of 6 months, with a subsequent report being brought back to this Committee for consideration, following consultation with residents and businesses.
