I apologise for the delay in responding to you. Integrated Transport is currently investigating the matter for installing pedestrian facilities at the vicinity of the above intersection. We are looking to install a pedestrian refuge in Darley Road near Danger Street if it is suitable to do so.  Randwick Precinct - Resolution 07082024(3) - removing spray paint road markings — "Your questions highlight the issues around line markings. The difference between spray markings and rubbish, is that rubbish is not required in the environment, so it is possible to remove at all times, unlike line markings. Many of the spray markings that you see are made by utilities companies. Utility companies (gas, water, telecommunications, etc.) generally do not make Council aware of work that they undertake, nor are they required to under legislation. The markings that are made by these companies, may or may not be required and Council may or may not be aware if they are required. The suggestion to report line markings to Council is so that Council can check whether the markings relate to Council works and fithey do and the job is complete, Council can remove the marks.
